Guest Speaker

Kirsten Wert from Smart Trips talks about the benefits of an active trip to and from school and age appropriate transportation goals for children. She also discusses Smart Trips recommendations for child safety on bikes and walking to the school and around town.

Move-a-thon Update

- 1. Incentives announced.
 - a. All students receive a free T-shirt

After School Enrichment

 - b. Many things that have been offered in the past are not covered under the PTO liability insurance, leaving PTO board members personally responsible.
 - c. Board members are meeting with Sunnyland PTA representatives to see if we can work together to find solutions.
 - d. Bellingham Public Schools administration is working on a way to have after school enrichment be offered in an equitable way at all schools, without relying on PTO/PTA involvement.

 - iii. It is one of the ways that the superintendent gets input for decision making.
 - iv. Members meet with the superintendent and other district staff on a monthly basis to discuss a variety of topics, share information, and broaden understanding of school related issues.

Administrative Items

1. General Meeting Minutes for September 2022 are approved.

Treasurer's Report

- 1. Income
 - a. The PTO income for the year to date is from Amazon Smiles and Fred Meyer Community Rewards. Remember to link your account to Parkview PTO if you shop with these husinesses
 - b. The goal is to raise most of the \$40,000 budget with the Move-a-thon fundraiser this month.

2. Expenses

- a. The largest part of the PTO budget goes towards field trips for every class.
- The second largest expense is stipends for teachers to purchase learning materials and other supplies.
- c. The third largest expense is PTO led whole school enrichment.
- d. We have approximately \$20,000 set aside beyond the \$40,000 for a capital project in the new school building.
 - Mr. C, Parkview PE teacher, has requested help with purchasing mats for the new gym using some of these funds.
 - ii. A committee is forming to work on ways to use these funds to bring art into the new facility. Volunteers for this committee can sign up on the PTO website.
- e. We have added a Community/Non-Profit Donations Fund to the budget.
 - i. It is budgeted for \$3,000.
 - ii. This is based on a funding request that was submitted to help students in need of funds for school lunches.
 - ii. The board will vote on using these funds in the spring.
- f. The PTO recently purchased calming chairs and tools for teacher classrooms based on a funding request from Principal Johnson.
- g. The PTO gives a percentage of our fundraising to the Elementary Equity Fund Pilot.
 - This fund pools a percentage of the fundraising from PTO/PTAs across the district and redistributes it based on free/reduced lunch status.
 - ii. Parkview is in a unique position because we have had strong fundraising in the past, but also qualify for a percentage of these funds based on our free/reduced lunch numbers.

Update from Principal Johnson

- 1. There is a glitch in the software for the new dismissal system, but the new orange cards will be coming home soon.
- A new crosswalk has been painted across Cornwall Avenue near the entrance of the school. The
 city will begin more involved work on that intersection in June when school is out of session. This
 will include bike lanes and changing the curve by the entrance into Cornwall Park into a Tintersection.
